
Alcoholics Anonymous is a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism.

I imagine most AA members are familiar with the term PI & CPC but not aware of TFC, well keep reading and you will be given an insight about what TFC stands for on the Sunshine Coast later in this article. PI & CPC in our District is responsible for implementing the following things locally on the Sunny Coast.

- <u>First</u> our "Professional's Luncheon" to be held in the second half of this year, I am pleased to report that planning is progressing well with names of people who have expressed an interest in attending this event being compiled. This event is held **bi-annually** and 2014 saw forty three professionals in attendance.
- <u>Second</u> we have "AA PI Flyers" being displayed on local buses to create AA awareness on the Sunshine Coast.
- <u>Third</u> due to the efforts of previous DCM Pete T we currently have AA CSA's (Community Service Announcements) being shown on Foxtel TV channels as well as the three commercial free to air channels.
- Fourth and a very important manner of creating AA awareness is our regular pamphlet drop to medical centres and other professionals by willing members this is often where names are given for our invite list as regards our "Professional's Luncheon".
- In June this year Caloundra will be hosting the "Remote Area Doctors" conference and AA has been invited to have an information booth participating for the three day duration of the conference. Names have already been forthcoming for this events roster.
- The "AA Schools Program" has its own Co-ordinator (Linda T) in District Nine and this is another very important PI service that she is conducting.

The very latest initiatives are the changes to our contact help line system.

We have implemented the **Telstra DOT system (Digital Office Technology)** whereby the contact mobile rings sequentially with the office phone meaning if someone calls the office number the mobile rings at the same time. This is a big plus for our caller as they get to speak to someone in response to their call. **This system is part of our entry into modern times along with the exciting new District Web-Site.**

We are also in the process of implementing the "Bar Coded AA Cards" to hand out to agencies and professionals as a resource to quickly find AA meetings in their locality.





DISTRICT 9 - SUNSHINE COAST : (Cont)

You may well be asking yourself what is **TFC?** Well it is simply a program run by the "Community Solutions Agency" on the Sunshine Coast in conjunction with the Caloundra and Maroochydore Courts.

The program allows for anyone appearing before the Court on an alcohol related matter to voluntarily commit to the TFC known by its full title as the "Time for Change" program. AA is invited along to their group sessions to share personal experiences as well as offering AA awareness information. We have a roster whereby we are able to send along both a male and female person to each of these sessions.

In earlier days I think we were seen as competitors but that has changed to the point that **TFC Co-ordinators ring us** in relation to any client that they think needs AA. TFC is not an abstinence based program but more about changing behaviours and harms. Indeed this is truly a big part of **Co-operation with professionals** and being able to be open minded about alcohol related matters.

In closing there is a possibility that we may be able to have two international speakers for the June Founders week. March last year we had Clancy and Mary from LA in the USA and if this happens it will be the same two people.
