#### Science review finds merit in AA methods for sobriety

A globally respected medical review has found Alcoholics Anonymous helps more people achieve sobriety than standard treatments for alcoholism.

Such is the importance of the review, that AA in Gympie has launched a public information campaign aimed initially at local medical professionals, court personnel and community and church leaders.

The Cochrane Review, which is the global gold standard in medicine for the integration of all the available research about a particular intervention, was co-authored by peers at the Stanford School of Medcine, Harvard Medical School and the European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction.

Among its conclusions is that Alcoholics Anonymous is the most effective path to abstinence.

A spokesperson for AA's Public Information Committee said, "We of AA in the Gympie area are very keen to spread the exciting news contained in this Cochrane Review, particularly among medical professionals, some of whom may understandably have dismissed AA in the past for want of sciencebased evidence of its effectiveness.

"Fortunately such reservations are no longer an issue as they are effectively addressed by this review".

The campaign includes writing to medical practitioners and others in order to draw their attention to the Review and includes a memory stick containing a 15-minute video featuring the co-authors explaining the Re-

view and its conclusions.

The letter appeals to recipients to consider suggesting to people with alcohol use disorder that AA may be worth investigation as part of a recovery program.

The letter includes Gympie AA flyers which contain names and contact numbers for the various AA Groups in Gympie.

Interested parties can access the video on Youtube by searching for 'Does Alcoholics Anonymous work' in the platform's search bar, or go to www.cochrane.org for the full review findings.

Today AA has a presence in about 180 nations and membership is estimated at more than two million.

There are more than 123,000 AA groups worldwide, and AA literature has been translated into more than 100 languages.

The fellowship is 87 years old and has existed in Gympie for 67 years.


Packs went out to 25 police Stations in Ipswich QLD.


